## Subject Assessment Headlines:

While this aspect of the pupil's development is important, it is inappropriate to make judgements on an individual's spiritual development. It is the provision that is recorded and monitored. Extensive evidence is collected and St Joseph and St Bede RC Primary School has been awarded Gold level of the National SMSC Quality Mark and this has been confirmed by the Quality Assurance Panel. This is due to be reviewed in February 2022.

# 6. Raising profile of subject:

Staff and pupils are very aware of the subject.

Parents will become more informed via stay and learn sessions and being explicity told how we teach SMSC through 'Big Questions' across the curriculum. This discussion should take place at the start of each academic year, during the welcome meeting.

### 2. Curriculum & Book Monitoring

Floor books are monitored as a whole Teaching staff during staff meetings. This allows the sharing of good practice, ensures consistency in expectations and development of deeper thinking across key stages.

1. Monitoring

Working closely with the Citizenship Team, SMSC is monitored

through book looks, planning, observations and Pupil Voice.

Staff Wellbeing is also monitored using staff questionnaire.

Medium term plans clearly identify well thought out 'Big Questions' with SMSC focus throughout the curriculum. This is monitored half Termly by HA.

At regular points throughout the year, drop ins into lessons to monitor lessons and planning by HA.

#### 4. Parent Links

Parent's views are <u>taken into account regularly</u> from questionnaires and their feedback is acted upon and shared 'You said...We did' approach.

<u>Parent's</u> are often invited to share their <u>childrens's</u> learning with home learning activities, Lenten appeals, challenges, projects and celebrations.
