Subject Assessment Headlines:

Much of RE is a development of personal values and attitudes and can be assessed through the children's attitude and approach to life. We plan 'Check In/Check Out' activities for each topic, this assesses their knowledge and progression of a certain topic. Children are assessed in a range of ways; through written work, art work, role play, puppets, videos and teacher dialogue. The 'Check In/Check Out' logo is used to show assessment pieces of work.

Subject Strengths

In our last RE inspection we achieved 'outstanding' in five of the seven areas; the quality of the Welfare, Witness, Worship and Welcome and the quality of the Catholic Leadership. Key strengths of the school were identified as: the ethos, relationships, behaviour and care for all within the school is outstanding.
